SMSC



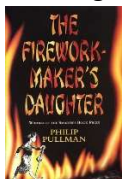
Write a story about a time when you have persevered with something challenging or difficult. How did you keep yourself going? What was the end outcome after persevering? How did this make you feel?

Music



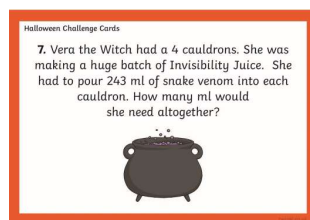
